

Christian Academy Middle School Summer Reading 2025 EXTRA CREDIT OPPORTUNITY



At Christian Academy, we believe that reading is important to all aspects of student success. We also understand that summer is a busy time for everyone, so we are making summer reading an optional, extra credit opportunity. Summer reading is **NOT REQUIRED**. If a student would like to earn one, two, or three levels of extra credit, he/she can complete the following:

1. Read a book from the suggested list for extra credit in ELA. Alternatively, students may read a parent-approved and appropriately challenging book that is not on the list. If in doubt about acceptability, email your question to the teacher specified for your child's grade.
2. For additional extra credit, read a second book using the same prerequisites as stated in item #1.
3. For the highest level of extra credit, read a third book using the same prerequisites as stated in item #1.
4. Extra Credit is capped at three books/levels of credit.
5. On the **Student/Parent Acknowledgement** page (second page in the complete document), record in writing the title, author, and number of pages of each completed extra credit book.
6. Each book your middle school student reads must be read cover to cover and should NOT be a junior or abridged version of the book listed.
7. Each book should be read **after June 5, 2025** and **before the beginning of the 2025-26** school year.
8. Parents, you are required to sign a document indicating that this is, indeed, when your child read the book(s).
9. In addition, the book(s) can not be ones your middle school student has read before.

A document which includes the reading list will be emailed to you at the end of the school year. The requirements also will be available on the school website under menu heading **activities**, and the submenu **summer information**.
