Community Service

Christian Academy strives to develop servant leaders through a program call Faith with Feet. High School Students participate in a variety of community service opportunities through school-sponsored events. Juniors and Seniors are required to complete an additional 30 hours of community service outside of school each year. Juniors and Seniors also have the opportunity to go on an international mission trip during the spring of each year.

Graduation Requirements

Students are required to complete four units in Bible, four units in English, four in Mathematics, four in Social Studies and four in Science. Students are encouraged to complete three units in Foreign Language and are required to complete one credit of Technology, one credit of Physical Education and one-half credit of health during the high school years. Students are required to complete at least one additional credit hour of elective study. Students are required to complete a minimum of 26 credits for Christian Academy graduation.

GPA/Rank

GPA is calculated using the SC Uniform Grading Scale. Grades are weighted according to the level of class: Advanced Placement (AP), Honors (H) or College Preparatory (CP). A weighted class rank is calculated at the end of each year for grades 9-12.

School Profile 2023-2024

History and Mission

Christian Academy was established in 1996 to provide excellent Christian education in the Grand Strand area. Christian Academy is an interdenominational, coeducational, college-preparatory school serving students in grades K-12. More than fifty churches are represented within this small school population. The school is governed by an independent Board of Trustees.

Christian Academy is a Christ-centered school serving the community by developing young Christian leaders through partnering with parents; to fuse the Christian faith with academics, athletics and fine arts into an excellent educational experience, and to graduate students prepared for college and ready to impact the world for Christ.

Accreditations

Christian Academy has been accredited by Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI), Cognia(AdvancEd) and South Carolina Independent School Association (SCISA) since 2002. Christian Academy is also a STEM Certified school through both Cognia(AdvancEd) and SCISA.

Faculty and Staff

Christian Academy values excellence in academics, believing that excellence honors God. Faculty includes a 11-member leadership team, 52 teaching faculty, and 9 support staff. More than 50% of the teaching faculty hold an advanced degree.

Admission

Students are admitted based on preadmission testing, standardized test scores, previous school academic and behavior records, as well as recommendations from former teachers. Students are admitted based on the school's assessment of their ability to succeed in a Christ-centered and challenging, engaging academic environment.

Calendar/Schedule

Classes for the 2023-2024 school year run on a traditional year long schedule with an eight period day. Classes meet for approximately 50 minutes. The school year runs from August 16, 2023 until May 31, 2024. Senior Graduation is scheduled for May 23, 2024.

High School Curriculum

Christian Academy offers a college preparatory curriculum, which includes traditional core classes as well as Bible and elective classes. Students may take Honors, CP(College Preparatory) or AP(Advanced Placement) level classes. Students may also take PACE dual credit classes at Horry Georgetown Technical College during their Senior year. At times, these PACE courses are offered in the Junior year as well. Students may also choose to take classes not offered at Christian Academy through the VirtualSC Program with administrative approval.
